Launc[H] was created through the Hartford and East Hartford community's participation in CTNext's Innovation Places program.

- Develops and executes strategic planning to grow Hartford's innovation ecosystem, in consultation with the Launc[H] Board of Directors
- Oversees the disbursement of \$2M annually in state funding to programs in the community annually; facilitates co-investment of matching funds in excess of \$3M annually from local corporations, foundations, and program revenue
- Maintains relationships with 30+ institutional partners in order to coordinate activities within the ecosystem, and help create a visible and vibrant community of innovators in Hartford

The Purpose Project was designed to connect different generations of social leaders—those who have spent their lives committed to missions of social change, and those who will be responsible for leading our society forward.

- Interviewed over 20 exemplary leaders of Connecticut-based, national, and international social change movements including 4 Nobel Laureates in service of capturing lessons learned and equipping emerging leaders.

- Published monthly series of features in Hartford Courant and produced accompanying Teacher's Guide that brought leadership lessons 4,000 students in grades 6-12
- Facilitated monthly community discussion forums between 50 experienced and emerging social leaders in the Greater Hartford area.
- Developed and hosted a semester-long community leadership seminar for emerging social leaders in partnership with the University of Connecticut's Nonprofit Leadership Program
- Principal fundraiser; established functional relationships with community partners, and managing relationships with program and community stakeholders.

The Business Council for Peace is a non-profit organization that helps women entrepreneurs in post-conflict countries expand their businesses, create employment, and build a peaceful future for their communities.

- Supported the development of a new brand of hand-made, fair-trade soccer balls, Dosti, which were introduced to the US market in the Fall of 2010.
- Supported the implementation of Bpeace Business Apprenticeship Road Trip (BART) for 12 female Afghan entrepreneurs in October, 2008. Coordinated and planned programming with over 10 host organizations; supported and accompanied visiting entrepreneurs during their month-long stay in the US.

Aid to Artisans is a non-profit organization dedicated to creating economic opportunities for crafts people in developing countries around the world. Comprehensive business development programs include technical assistance and capacity building, product design and development, business skills development, and marketing and promotional support

- Traveled to Afghanistan in Nov-Dec. 2006 to assist with setting up new field office, hiring staff, and establishing relationships with partner organizations in the development community and craft sector.
- Managed two 3-year, USAID funded programs in Peru and Bolivia with a combined operating budget of \$4.26M, traveling frequently to field offices for face-to-face working sessions with field staff and meetings with local donor representatives.
- Designed and managed regional craft development initiative in Cajamarca, Peru in partnership with International Finance Corporation.

- Led project teams consisting of both home and field office staff. Functioned as liaison between field-based project leader and key decision-makers in the home office.
- Responsible for achieving results of each project and evaluating effectiveness of program activities, and designing, reallocating for, and implementing changes as needed.
- Responsible for hiring consultants, creating work plans and providing necessary support in preparation and during their trip.
- Primary donor contact for all programs: responsible for achieving project results, developing and reporting on key program metrics, and cultivating positive donor relationships. Also responsible for ensuring grant compliance and drafting and submitting all funder correspondence and reporting.
